We ask that you select the posters that best convey this year's theme. Please complete the Educator Poster Submission Form and include with your students' posters.

Theme: "Peace is being" ("Peace means being....")

Format: Poster board, 22 X 28 inches, two-dimensional media only, weather-resistant (recommended). Posters submitted will be considered a donation to the Peace Day Festival for fund-raising at a silent auction to support the Peace Activities of the Committee.

Information on the back of poster: Name of student, school and grade level, teacher name and contact information (phone number and e-mail address).

Student Entry Form: Include title and description ("Peace is being...." or "Peace means being...," 25-words or less), student name, school, grade, teacher's name and parent permission.

Deadline for submission: Friday, September 11, 2009. Mail posters and supporting information to Honoka'a Hongwanji Buddhist Temple P.O. Box 1667, Honoka'a, HI 96727. Call 808 775-7232 to make arrangements to drop off the posters.

Prizes: First, Second, Third prizes (\$50, \$35 and \$25) for each grade category, K-3, 4-6, 7-9, 10-12. Grand Prize for "Best in Show" – One night stay for winner and parents at Waianuhea Bed & Breakfast, Ahualoa, Big Island (minimum value \$200).
